Ibec, Teagasc, ITT & the IFA presents a host of industry specialists to discuss the proposed SSRH, the technologies available and what steps heat users can take to avail of the support.”





Commercial and Industrial heat users are about to be presented with an exciting opportunity to convert to renewable heating systems over the next 12 months. The SEAI have been tasked by DCCAE to design and role out the Support Scheme for Renewable Heat (SSRH), a scheme focusing on giving financial incentives to commercial and industrial users of heat to convert to renewable heating systems.

This workshop is aimed at energy managers and procurement officers, and is designed to provide information around the opportunities for companies through the SSRH. We have an expert panel to discuss the SSRH scheme, ESCO contracting (where the installation and operation of heating systems can be fully managed by an ESCO company) and fuel matters such as quality and the supply chain.

There will also be opportunities to meet suppliers of heating systems who will be more than willing to discuss your own business and how you could convert to renewable heating.
