Kilkenny central access scheme, one way system discussed I mentioned that older people might not be able to walk distance to parking.

2000 energy saving bulbs have been put up this year to save the County Council €600,000 a year.

Cllr. Fidelis Doherty discussed N25 Waterford road and Abbey road to Belmont Rd

Trees survey in Ferrybank and bus shelter in Glenmore seems to be closed.

Hydrants

Must be 6 metres from a house and 46 metres from a housing estate

Water is saved under and over ground tanks 20,000 to 35,000 litres

Shopping centres must have 20-75,000 litres. Kilkenny Aldi has a storage tank for two places. I think it has 300,000 litres above and below ground the flow should be 8-12 litres

The hydrant marker states how close water is to the Hydrant and on the H sign 100 is diameter of connection, every village should have water storage or maybe the local stream will do. Rosedale in Kilmacow has a hydrant.

The H sign should not be on the ground in case of snow it might be covered.

Kilmacow is getting money for a footpath up Chapel Hill under village renewal scheme for safety reasons.

Broadband and telephones companies apply for road opening permits under Department of Community and Culture. Cost vary between €150 –€250 depending on the size of the job.
