On Wednesday morning the Minister for Business, Enterprise and Innovation, Heather Humphreys, TD officially launched the Abbey Quarter formerly the Smithwicks Brewery in the heart of the City. The event was well attended with representatives from the political, business, community and education sectors.

The minister gave a well received address and the CEO of Kilkenny County Council Collette Byrne gave an inspiring speech. She talked about the ambitious plans for the site that will offer a mix of business, educational, community and living spaces with a mix of social and private housing. She was respectful of the heritage of the site and emphasised the importance of preserving the past while planning for the future. She put pressure on the Minister to consider the development an IT Educational campus on the site and urged her to consider Kilkenny as the prime location for the recently proposed National Design Centre.
